

Dear Member,

It's hard to believe that we have come to the end of another year, a milestone year with Ten years under our belts! We have come a long way from humble beginnings to the largest ATV club on the east coast. This past year we have accomplished almost every goal we put before ourselves, it's been a banner year. Some of the highlights of the year include:

- Kitchen: an addition, walk in cooler, new fryer, warming drawers, new shelves, finished tile and new exhaust fans.
- Track: finished smiling bob, catwalk, updated computers, built registration building, fixed return lane, reset sponsor signs, new lights
- Pavilion: finished walls including sponsor, booster, members and logo areas. Repainted tables, replaced shale
- Snack Shack: closed in area, installed doors, added an ice cream unit, refrigerator, freezer, new shelves and secure consignment area
- Chicken Pit: built "chicken coop", expanded seating area, installed tile and electric, stained coop and pit, installed sponsor signs
- First Aid: Built a Safe Heaven first aid station, installed electric, tile and cabinets
- Manland: erected a 24 x 40 equipment building, began electric, installed sponsor signs
- Office: painted, rubber roof, installed base station, finished electric, heat and seating
- Motocross track: received a face lift and resurface, sponsor signs installed
- Trails: installed new bridges, opened new properties, groomed, trimmed, piped and rerouted.
- Playground: added new pieces, added Drive in screen
- Campground: Finished upper road, added camping spots
- General: Reshaped parking, access, entrance and exit roads, added directional signage to entrances and exits, keyed all structures.

All in all much has been accomplished by many hands and we thank everyone who lent a hand either by blister or greenback.

Our events finished strong with a good September Open House grossing \$10,000 and one of our best Haunted rides ever grossing just under \$18,000. Event revenues are vital to our organization for day to day expenses.

As we enter into a new year and a new decade for our organization we have a strength in our history new horizons in our future. As an adage says what's old is new again, the officers that will bring us into our next ten years adheres to that adage. At the general election the presiding officers remained the same. Our board of directors are: Scott Repine, Randy Wike, Christopher Gardner, Keith Walters, Sherry Urish, Carl Fabrizio and officers of President Tom Urish, Vice president Ronnie Lute, Secretary Ann Repine.

A newsletter by definition is filled with news and we have some big NEWS and lots of news to share, so be sure to read through the following pages carefully.

BIGGEST NEWS: We are now the proud owners of 266 acres of previously leased land. As you know from previous newsletters and appeals we have been diligently raising funds in the anticipation of acceptance of an offer we made on 36 acres of land. Thank goodness we had a plan for when one door doesn't open another one does! We were approached to purchase some of the land we currently lease. After several months, we closed on the property the Wednesday before Christmas. This brings the total property owned by the club to 596 acres and we will continue to lease or have land agreements on surrounding properties. Winter is a rough time to make purchases and traditionally we don't make any major purchases after September because even with 2 good events the general bills that need paid to carry through until spring can make the budgets tight. Our closing costs were much higher than anticipated and though we were able to cover the strain on a tight budget requires us to not only encourage early renewals but also to start our spring fundraiser early as our new mortgage payments begin January 22, 2011. Enclosed with this newsletter you will find a membership renewal form. All members who renew prior to January 31 will receive a coupon for every eligible family member redeemable for either a logo hat or logo bag. (i.e. You renew January 15th, husband wife and 2 kids you will receive 4 coupons). Remember that renewals are due March 31st 2011 to receive the discounted pricing. BOOSTER PROGRAM:

Explanation of events

Open Houses: These events are designed to showcase what our club has to offer to members. They are a cornerstone in recruiting new members and allow current members to bring legally bring their friends. The cost is \$15 per person which will be applied to membership if they chose to join. Members are expected to bring a dozen or more hospitality cupcakes. Members could also offer to take out tours for our guest as this is the request asked most often and usually we are short handed.

Changes? Keep in mind we may or may not be able to provide complimentary dinner, this entirely depends on our sponsor renewals.

September Open House also features our regular Saturday night Drags. Guests who want to attend the drag races only will be charged the same \$15 however voucher to be used towards racing or the kitchen.

Drags:

Members are admitted through the gate Free. Members pay for racing the same as non members. Alcohol is not permitted in the pit area nor while racing. Non Member Racers are not admitted until 4:30 PM on any drag event and must leave the property within a 1/2 of the close of racing. Drag events that are held on the same day as weekend events will follow the following protocol: Non member racers who come on the day or another scheduled event who arrive and demand entrance prior to 4:30pm will be admitted as if they came for the event, pay that price and be treated as any other guest. Non member Racers who come only to race on the day of a scheduled event are admitted only after 4:30 pm, they are not permitted to ride the trails, they will pay the event going rate (i.e. \$15) and be issued a voucher (i.e. \$10) to be used towards racing or in the kitchen. This will hopefully minimize gate issues. All non member racers must be off property within 30 minutes following the last race. Non

Open Invitational: complete details will be forthcoming. The invitational will be more structured and similar to an open house. We will expand this event to be advertised and open to the public. It will also feature drags Saturday evening as well as some sort of entertainment. The BBQ pit will be open.

Cash Bash Bonanza: This is an entirely new event for us. It is a limited ticket event. Drawings for CASH will be held every 15 minutes plus more cash and prize winning opportunities. Food and Beverages are included in ticket price. Members are asked to support this event by helping work the event or purchasing/selling tickets. Tickets, payouts and complete details will be available soon.

Haunted Rides: By far our biggest fundraising event of the year. . You will notice in the schedule will moved the September Open House earlier in the month to allow for more uninterrupted fall riding. Trails are closed the 3 Saturdays of the Haunted Rides. It is absolutely necessary to close the trails, all your membership materials remind you of the only closed dates through the year these 3 days and the 2 weeks of deer season. Trails are closed for your safety.

Changes? This year we will have "skits scenes" established so that if a member wants to participate but can only do one weekend or a few hours they will have an opportunity to do so.

BIG CHANGE: Last year we changed the gate process so that members were not held up waiting in line, at events we will do this again. When you come and have your membership cards to show at the blue gate post they will direct you through the "short" entrance and you are on your way. Everyone in the vehicle must be a member in good standing, guests, renewals etc will have to go through the main gate as usual.

No the secretary cannot fill it out for you nor sign your name for liability issues. The secretary also does not like nasty notes regarding how stupid this policy is or how you are not going to comply. The insurance requires it, we cannot renew you without it.
